Description of Programs & Activities

GAOG Board & General Body Meetings

In order to continue ongoing effective progress of our organization, the GAOG schedules its Executive Board Meetings (EBM) on the first Friday of each month. At the EBM's, the executive board is tasked with setting the direction of the organization, discussing organizational strategy, evaluating programming, and voting on issues that are critical to our success. The EBM is held at Holy Cross Church at 2005 South Columbia Drive, Decatur, GA 30032. Meetings are held from 7:00pm to 10:00pm.

Our General Membership Meeting (GMM) is scheduled on the third Sunday of each month, and is attended by all of our general members and invited guests. Each month, we have a guest speaker or presenter who facilitates such topics as health and wellness, financial viability, culture, and other notable topics. During Black History Month, we invite guest speakers to discuss a topic related to our African heritage. At the GMM, we also discuss the minutes from our previous meeting, review the Treasurer's report, vote on issues, and discuss other important topics. At the conclusion of general membership meetings, members are encouraged to fellowship with one another and reach out to our guests. The GMM is held at Holy Cross Church at 2005 South Columbia Drive, Decatur, GA 30032. Meetings are held from 6:00pm to 9:00pm.

Memorial Weekend: The Guyana Family Fun Day and Independence Ball

The Guyana Family Fun Day:

The Guyana Family Fun Day is held annually on the Sunday of Memorial Weekend in Atlanta, Georgia. This activity usually draws close to 5,000 attendees each year for an afternoon of fun, games, and family gathering. During this event, attendees can expect to be treated to a plethora of cultural events such as music performances, a kids tent, pony rides, soccer matches, cricket matches, various Caribbean food vendors for your choice of cuisine, a caricature artist, plaiting of the maypole, an astro jump, track and field, and other wonderful events for the entire family. Members of the Guyana Association of Georgia manage the daily operation of this event, which begins around 12:00pm (noon) and closes at 8:00pm. We attract attendees from various Caribbean countries, as well as non-Caribbean attendees who enjoy the culture, food, games, and just being in an atmosphere they enjoy. Proceeds from this event are invested in an educational fund for our Guyanese youth in the form of scholarships, which are awarded annually at our Scholarship and Awards Banquet.



The Independence Ball:

The Independence Ball is an event to celebrate the Independence anniversary of the Cooperative Republic of Guyana, which occurred on May 26, 1966. It is coincidental that our anniversary as an independent country occurs over the Memorial weekend, so it is quite fitting that we have this ball to commemorate our independence on the Sunday evening of Memorial weekend following the Guyana Family Fun Day event and share the anniversary with friends and family. Over the past 18 years, we have grown to a consistent attendance of 700-800 attendees at our independence ball, which features key entertainment from major Guyanese and Caribbean bands and a featured DJ. Over the years, attendees have been treated to the sounds of De Untouchables, Sound Dimension, CFN Band, Blue Ventures, Byron Lee and the Draggonaire, and many others. Attendees come to enjoy an evening of dining and dancing, and dressed formally in tuxedos and evening gowns for a night of elegance.

Community Service Projects

Among our core values, the GAOG is focused on service and commitment to the community in which we operate as a non-profit organization. We consistently engage our community with committed service, where our members have participated in many events as volunteers. These events include, but are not limited to:

Feed the Hungry – Members participate each year to feed hundreds of homeless families with hot meals to men, women, and children. We are entering into our 14th year of commitment to Feed the Hungry.

Samaritan's Feet – Members of the GAOG donated almost 300 pairs of shoes and socks last year to young children through the Rescue Atlanta Mission.

Sick and Shut In – We actively participate in visiting the homes of our elderly during the Christmas season to sing carols and partake in Christmas stories. The comfort and spirited singing brings joy each year to those individuals who are unable to leave their homes.

As an organization, we will continue our visibility in the community as well as consider partnering with other organizations for the purpose of our on-going commitment to community service.

Scholarship and Awards Banquet

This signature annual event is held at the end of summer where we recognize our young high school graduates with academic scholarships to be applied toward their college expenses. These recipients are the sons and daughters of Guyanese



parentage, who are paid members of the GAOG. Some of the majors selected by our young scholarship recipients are engineering, accounting, finance, biology, pre-med, political science, computer science, mathematics, education, psychology, economics, veterinary science, and many others. The youth of today are our future doctors, lawyers, entrepreneurs, politicians, teachers, economists, scientists, corporate executives, and engineers. The GAOG takes an active role in making sure that our young high school graduates are rewarded for their diligent work and ambitious approach to personal development.

Also at the Scholarship and Awards Banquet, the GAOG recognizes its members who have contributed to the organization throughout the year on our committees and boards. These members give selflessly of their time to the ongoing success of our organization in a volunteer capacity, and they are recognized for their tireless efforts. Community businesses and entrepreneurs are also recognized for their successful business activity with awards.

Youth Symposium

The Youth Symposium is a program to be piloted in the summer of 2009 which will involve young children in our Guyanese community who will participate in various personal development programs. These programs include, but are not limited to interactive workshops, college prep discussions, panel discussions, leadership development, speaking and presentation skills, peer mentoring, entrepreneurship, and other activities which promote personal development among our youth to prepare them for a successful future.

This potential annual symposium is a day-long event, with much of the facilitator participation coming from our professional business community who are partnered with our organization. All of the activities are youth-centered and discussion topics are subject to change each year to maintain participant's interest. The youth symposium is intended to be our main youth program for the year, among other programs that we organize, and we invite our community businesses to partner with us to make this a success.
